City Election papers available

The opportunity to run for political office is a privilege we enjoy in our society. Citizens are fortunate that so many good people offer their time and talents for public service. The business of city government and local leadership presents a unique opportunity to resolve issues, accomplish goals, and affect the future of your community.

The City of Walnut conducts business on the first Thursday of each month. The meetings are generally held at 5:00 p.m., with additional work sessions and special meetings when necessary.

It is not too early to begin thinking about running for either City Council or Mayor. There will be four positions on the November 7th ballot, three positions on the City Council and the Mayor's position. The term on the City Council is four years, and the Mayor's term is for two years. In order to hold office in the City, a candidate must be an eligible elector, meeting the same qualifications required to vote and be a resident of the City. Nomination papers may be picked up at either the City Clerk's office or the Pottawattamie County Auditor's office. Nominees must obtain ten eligible signatures. Candidate filing begins on Monday, August 28, 2017 and ends with papers due at the City Clerk's office by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 21, 2017.

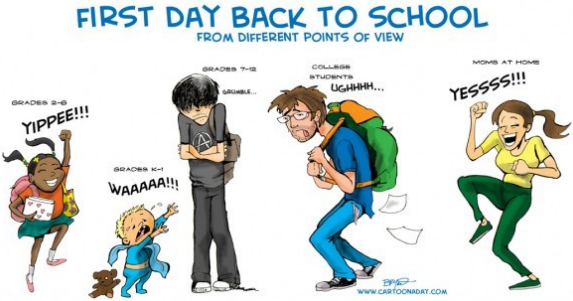
- ◆ You can pay your water bill online by eCheck or credit card at www.walnutiowa.org.
